
A Time for Renewal

The season of Lent is upon us. 40 days and nights to reflect on Jesus’ death and resurrection. As we move deeper into Lent, I believe that it is a good time for self-reflection and a deepening of our love for Jesus Christ. Lent is also a time of spiritual renewal, where we seek to make positive changes in our lives.

I selected two new pieces of music for the upcoming season: “Mercy” by Craig Courtney and “The Meditations of My Heart” by Elaine

Hagenberg. "Mercy" is a beautiful anthem commissioned for the fiftieth anniversary of Geneva Presbyterian Church in Laguna Woods, California. It includes the Latin phrase Kyrie Eleison which translates to Lord Have Mercy. Mercy is an important theme throughout Lent. The lyrics also speak to compassion and renewal. "Meditations of My Heart" contains a beautiful piano accompaniment. The rhythms in the piano are in triplet form, opposing the duple meter that is sung. Therein lies the challenge in the piece. The text reads: Lord my Rock, O Lord my strength, O Lord my God and Redeemer. I hope both pieces can be studied and recorded to add to the livestream and the sanctuary service in the coming weeks.

I sincerely hope we all have some time for reflection and renewal during the season of Lent as we await the joyful celebration of Easter Sunday.

deepest parts of our nature), exposing and judging the very thought and intentions of the heart." Hebrews 4:12 (AMP)

If you have The Bible app on your device, this verse has probably popped up within the past two weeks, in the transcription you've set. Since I like words, and usually study a different version, the amplified style suits me well in the app. Paul tells us clearly what I've been muddling about attempting to convey. The answers to how we're to live, treat others, and raise our children exist in the word of God.

Often, when reading passages, especially in the Gospels, I'll notice a specific word for the first time. I know that it's the same Bible I've been studying from for years, yet there it is. I don't remember that particular word being there before! I've read the passage hundreds of times, how and why did that word stand out now? Suddenly the entire passage is renewed! This happens in the moment I am seeking answers to one of life's difficulties, particularly something emotionally charged. When this happens to you, spend time with the passage – this isn't a homework assignment with a due date, but rather an assignation with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. I challenge you now to go back, reread Hebrews 4:12, read it from your physical Bible, let the language seep into you. Imagine the poetry in action. Consider spending time in meditation on this verse. Ask God to puncture your joints and marrow to expose yourself to you. Thankfully, He already knows.





Are you feeling the STRESS

... our kids are too!

In this pandemic, in our all-important busyness, there is often a subtle temptation to overlook the precious little lives that dwell in our very homes and churches.

You’re not the only one feeling the stress. Little eyes, little ears, little bodies and tender souls are doing their best to process this

COVID-19 experience alongside their parents – with far fewer tools. Try as we might to conceal it from them, a new “homeschool life,” coupled with a new “work-from-home-world,” or worse, a “no-work-at-all-world” - positions often anxious children in full view of life’s troubling complications. While we likely have ways of processing the noise, it’s entirely possible that our children might be overlooked.


On one hand, this is to be expected. There is, after all, a lot to do in these days. For most, the volume of work and responsibility has not slowed down, but rather has found a new and higher gear. Work that once took minutes in the office, now takes much of the day in divided attention. There’s also church life to attend to. There are burdens to bear, video meetings to coordinate, people to love. Then there’s the mission that we’re called to embrace. People are dying, others are ill, still others grieving for economic loss or mental health setbacks. We know that we must attend to these needs and both declare and demonstrate the Good News with the hope Jesus brings.

But in these seasons of crisis, in our all-important busyness, there is often a subtle temptation to overlook the precious little lives that dwell in our very homes and churches. We often forget that they are processing, perhaps for the first time, life in a broken world. They are coming to grips with a world where things like an invisible bug can wreak such havoc, and where death and destruction are suddenly normative realities. To neglect them in this season might be to miss our highest mission. To fail to engage them might be to miss the most formative season that we, as parents, caregivers, friends, teachers, pastors and family may have to interpret the Gospel with our children and disciple them to maturity.

How can we as a church help them?

- Ask them what they are feeling and thinking
- Send an encouraging note, birthday card
- Be a volunteer in Kids’ Ministry so you can pour the LOVE of Jesus into them

- Adopt a family that might be struggling and offer to cook a meal, do a zoom story time
- Pray for the kids on a daily basis
- Pray for the parents as they navigate these trying times




COMING IN APRIL

The name 'Love Modesto' signifies where Trinity United's focus will be during the last two weeks of April this year as we reach out in love to a group of our neighbors who need encouragement.

We at Trinity United are appreciative for all the service that our area's essential workers are doing, often under very stressful conditions. Many of them have flagging energy and dampened spirits as this year starts.

We're planning an outreach activity that everyone in our church family can participate in. It would focus on blessing the individuals that we know who are in essential jobs, as well as on the colleagues of those individuals. We'll write 'thank you' letters to police and firemen, bake cookies for teachers, and give baskets of tea and coffee to our nurses to share with their colleagues at work. Everything will be wrapped with prayer and sent with God's love. Watch for more information next month about 'Loving on' Modesto!

One of the items on the Giving Tree is wheelchairs. This month I would like to share about the wheelchair distribution. The process starts months before we arrive in Guatemala. Bethel Ministries International (BMI) screens the applications from families requesting wheelchairs, walkers, or crutches. Unfortunately, not all requests are able to be met. Once the screening process is completed the warehouse workers begin assembling wheelchairs they have received from the United States. Many of the wheelchairs need new seats, cushions, wheels, foot supports, and more. Around 90% of the workers assembling the wheelchairs are in wheelchairs themselves. They once were on the street begging and now because of the ability to move freely on wheels they are working and supporting their families and homes. Part of the \$170 for one wheelchair goes toward their salary.

A few days before we arrive in Guatemala, the different size chairs are pulled from the warehouse. The social worker visits the recipients to let them know they have been chosen and what the process will be. The chairs are loaded onto a truck and taken to the area we are working in.

The day of distribution, families arrive hours in advance. Many carry the person in need who may be a teen or an adult. We set up stations after unloading the truck and organizing the wheelchairs by size and style. Families are called to the stations where we fit a wheelchair to them, adjust foot supports, attach seat belts, and cushions. Some of the

special needs fittings take over an hour! I love this time because we get to share Jesus with the families, play with the children and dance with them! It is our time to witness to them. The Holy Spirit translates for us. It is amazing! They are so thankful. There are many tears of joy.

The process is not over. The whole family meets with local pastors who tell them about Jesus, salvation, and pray with them. In 2019 over 30 people accepted Christ! All families leave with a Bible. The local pastors follow up with all families. I can't wait to share Jesus and help give people freedom of mobility!

Fill those Easter Baskets with the gift that truly keeps giving and I don't mean chocolate! 39 wheelchairs are still needed. Please help support the families of Guatemala.

God is so good! Thank you to many people who have supported the Giving Tree for Guatemala! We are at 33% of our funding goal. Below is the current status of fundraising efforts and what is still needed for the Guatemala Giving Tree.



And so it goes.


Yet we chose paths away from your Word,
